This Addendum is issued prior to receipt of Bids to provide for certain changes and clarifications to the Specifications and Plans. This is hereby made a part of the Contract Documents and shall be taken into consideration in preparing bid proposals. All other conditions shall remain the same. **The Bidder shall acknowledge the receipt of this Addendum by signing below, including this addendum sheet with their proposals, and completing the Addenda section on page 1 of the Section 00 41 00 Bid Form of the project specifications.** Failure to include a signed Addenda in the submission of the proposal may be justification for the proposal being rejected as non-responsive.

The following information lists the extent of this Addendum. Descriptions of the changes or clarifications are given within each heading.

CONTRACTOR QUESTIONS

- Q: The new bid sheet has 70. Rough Grading of Treatment Wetlands 5,000 Syd & 71. Fine Grading of Treatment Wetlands 4,000 Syd. Are the quantities & units of measure correct?
- A: Yes, these numbers are accurate. The rough grading covers the banks and blending and the fine grading covers the bottom of the wetlands.
- Q: Can existing topsoil be used for native planting and seeding areas? What depth is required?
- A: Existing topsoil can be re-used for native planting and seeding areas, provided it meets the Topsoil requirements outlined in 32 93 00.10 Fine Grading Native Seeding and Plug Planting. Depth of topsoil is 4", with the exception of the swales on the Back 11 (6" depth) and the Treatment wetland soil mix (6" depth.) The Treatment Wetland Soil Mix is 1 part 2NS sand to 3 parts topsoil- Refer to 2.07 Treatment Wetland Soil Mix in 31.20.00.20 Treatment Wetland Earthwork spec.
- Q: Plugs are not in tray quantity and we have to buy the whole flat. Will it be tolerable to plant extras on site next to their appropriate species groups?
- A: The Plant Schedule refers to individual plug quantities rather than flat quantities to avoid confusion. Planting extra plugs in species groups is acceptable.
- Q: For irrigation for plant establishment, does the project include the provision for a golf course coupler to drag hose from each hole's line?
- A: We do not have a problem if the contractor requests to install a quick coupler valve near the area(s) to be seeded as long as there is good communication between the contractor and the golf course staff about the location of the valve(s).

- Q: In our experience we don't like watering seed mixes from sprinkler systems/unnecessarily/excess, so just running adjacent irrigation zones doesn't make biological sense - hose and more specific watering is better, and will limit the amount we have to estimate for invasive species control. Any opinions or info on how we should arrange hose watering of container planted areas? Have you talked to the golf staff about coupler locations?
- A: The golf course staff is not prepared to assist with a hands-on watering program. As mentioned before, the contractor can recommend and install a quick coupler valve to irrigate the areas with their preferred watering program, but it will fall under their responsibilities. The golf course can provide the water and the staff will help facilitate things for the contractor as long as everyone is communicating often.
- Q: On Sheet 18 of the Plans, there is a detail for an alternate bituminous golf cart path but there isn't a line item for that on the Bid Form. Was this a mistake or will another Bid Form be issued?
- A: The bituminous golf cart path detail is meant for any damage that occurs to an existing asphalt golf cart path. The contractor will need to replace that path at their own cost which is why there is not a line item on the Bid Form. The gravel path line items are meant for the known path disruptions.
- Q: Where is the "Debarment Certification" form located?
- A: In the original Spec Book, the form can be found on page 76 (of 363). This is part of Section 00 45 17 – Debarment Certification (page 2 of 2).

SUMMARY

Addendum No. 2 has been issued to clarify, modify, and add additional items to the original Bid Package. The Contractor shall acknowledge receipt of Addendum No. 2 by signing in the location provided below and incorporating Addendum No. 2 with the submission of this bid and acknowledgement on page 1 of the Proposal. Failure to include Addendum No. 2 and its attachments will result in rejection of the bid.
