This Addendum is issued prior to receipt of bids to provide for certain changes and clarifications to the Specifications and/or the Plans, as herein specified, and is hereby made a part of the Contract Documents and shall be taken into consideration in preparing the Proposal. All other conditions remain the same. The following lists the extent of this Addendum. Descriptions of the changes or clarifications are given within each heading. Please note that the date and time of the bid opening is still scheduled for Tuesday, October 24, 2023 at 2:30 pm, at the City of Utica 7550 Auburn Rd, Utica, MI 48317.

The Bidder shall acknowledge the receipt of this Addendum by signing this Addendum and enclosing it in the submission of his bids. Failure to enclose Addendum No. 1 in the submission of bids may be justification for the bid proposal being considered as non-responsive and rejected.

The following lists the extent of this Addendum. Description of the changes or clarifications are given within each heading:

# **SPECIFICATIONS:**

#### Section 00300 – Proposal

The quantities for a number of the pay items have been revised, namely the items for "Pre-Lining & Post-Lining, Clean & Televise with PACP Reporting, \_\_\_ inch San Sewer" and "Sewer Lining, CIPP, \_\_ inch Diameter Sewer" for the 8", 12", 15", 18" and 24" diameter sewers. Also revised the quantities related to the lengths of the inverted siphon investigation items. The entire section is being re-issued with this Addendum No. 1, and must be used when submitting the bid.

# **QUESTIONS SUBMITTED BY BIDDERS:**

Written questions received by 5:00 p.m. on October 18, 20203 are listed below, along with the answer by the Engineer. Questions are presented in a paraphrased manner. The answers provided herein become part of the Contract Documents, and are intended to supplement or supersede any relevant specifications or provisions included in the Contract Documents.

1. Is mobile/temporary traffic lighting allowed to be used as a part of our traffic control plan? Temp/mobile traffic control devices (arrow boards, trailing vehicles, etc.) are suitable for work on local, neighborhood streets to isolate your immediate work zone. However, those by themselves will not be sufficient for the work on State of Michigan and Macomb County jurisdiction roads where lane closures have to be permitted and follow MDOT requirements. Barrels/delineators, arrow boards and signs will be needed, deployed in accordance with the general details included in Appendix C of the bidding documents.



#### 2. Does every segment of CIPP installed have to be tested by a 3rd party testing agency?

Part 3.11 in Section 02708 of the Specifications cover testing samples from installed CIPP liners. For this project, the Contractor shall prepare test specimens from each and every liner installed. The Contractor is responsible for submitting only one of the samples from each diameter/thickness group of samples for the specified third-party testing. If unsatisfactory results are received, then all other samples from that particular diameter/thickness group will then be required to be submitted for the specified third-party testing. If satisfactory results are received, deliver the untested specimens to the Engineer for storage until the contract warranty period expires in case other testing is required.

## 3. What are the flow rates at the inverted siphons and trunkline sewers?

Appendix D includes a past sanitary sewer study completed for the City of Utica that shows estimated sanitary flows at various points within the existing sewer system. Following are updated peak sanitary flows (dry-weather) at the particular points requested that can be used to help assign potential bid pricing. Please note that these flows are theoretical, and the Contractor is responsible for handling whatever flows that are encountered during the course of the project. We have noted that precipitation events (rainfall and/or snowmelt) will increase the base flow in the City's sanitary sewer system to some degree, and that certain construction activities may not be able to be completed when higher than normal flows are occurring. Accordingly, the schedule for completion of the Work must account for a reasonable number of days where is not practicable to proceed with certain items of work that are affected by potentially higher than normal flows.

- a) For the east siphon at the end of Greeley, the design peak san flow would be approximately Points E plus G plus about 70 REU (0.04+4.04+0.13=4.21 cfs).
- b) For the north siphon at the end of Davis, the design peak san flow would be approximately Point H minus Points E plus G minus about 40 REU minus 175 senior housing units minus 11 acres school + baseball venue (4.96-0.04-4.04-0.07-0.22-0.10+0.25=0.74 cfs).
- c) Points G, H and I are along the "trunkline" sewers, but add 0.25 cfs to points H and I to consider today's conditions with baseball stadium.

# 4. Will contractors be able to use City hydrants for water?

Use of City water for construction activities related to this project will be permitted. Request the permit from the Department of Public Works (586-731-6110). Hydrant use permits for City work are at no charge.

- a) The City will provide meter/backflow equipment for the Contractor's use. Water use for construction related activities is metered for water-loss accounting purposes, and will not be charged to the Contractor.
- b) The number of hydrants to be used throughout the course of the project shall be minimized. Coordinate with City DPW for selection of hydrants to use. DPW personnel will install and remove the meter as needed.
- c) Take care when filling trucks from hydrant connections to assure that the hydrant flow does not disturb any accumulated sediments in the water main system and cause discolored water. If complaints from customers occur in areas where hydrants are being used, actions must be taken to eliminate the sediment disturbance. Actions may include changing filling operations, flushing the water system until clear water is observed, or in some cases where these efforts are not successful, abandon use of the particular hydrant.
- d) Hydrants shall be pumped dry after use. During winter months where freezing is possible, pump dry at the end of each work day.



e) Contractor will be responsible for cost of repairing damage to hydrants or the water distribution system resulting from improper operation of valves and hydrants.

#### **SUMMARY:**

This Addendum No. 1 has been issued in order to clarify, modify, and add additional items to the original Bid Package. The Contractor shall acknowledge receipt of this Addendum No. 1 by signing in the location provided below and incorporating this Addendum No. 1 with the submission of his bid. To stay within the available project budget, the Owner, at their sole discretion, reserves the right to increase or decrease the pay item quantities or to eliminate items of work in the project contract before award or during construction. No additional compensation or adjustment to unit prices or lump sum prices will be made to the Contractor due to reduction/addition or deletion of any pay item in this contract.

Each Proposal must be accompanied by a bid deposit in the form of a certified check, cashier's check or bid bond, executed by the bidder and Surety Company, payable to the City of Utica in the amount of Five Percent (5%) of the amount of the Proposal. See Instructions to Bidders – Bid Deposit for more information.

#### **TAXES**

The Bidder affirms that all applicable Federal, State and Local taxes of whatever character and description are included in all prices stated in this Form of Proposal.

#### **FEES**

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The Bidder shall refer to the General Conditions for allowable Fees for additional work performed, upon Owner's written authorization, by Bidder's own forces and/or for additional work, upon Owner's written authorization, by Bidder's subcontractors.

## TIME OF COMPLETION

If awarded the Contract for the **2023 Sewer Rehabilitation Program Project**, we agree to have all work completed by **August 2, 2024**. Substantial Completion is defined that the facility is ready to use for its intended purpose with all utility systems fully functional.

The Bidder hereby agrees to furnish the required Bonds, Insurance Certificates, and Policies within ten (10) days after acceptance of this Proposal.

Final Completion with all clean-up and punch-list items shall be complete by August 30, 2024.

The execution of all work and specific constraints as described in the contract drawings and specifications, with particular reference to Section 02030 Sequence of Construction and Special Project Requirements, must be strictly adhered to.

#### LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

Time is of the essence for completion of this project in order to have the Project ready for the City of Utica. The Bidder guarantees that he/she can and will complete the work within the time limit stated hereinbefore or within the time as extended as provided elsewhere in the Specifications. Inasmuch as the damage and loss to the Owner which will result from the failure of the Bidder to complete the work within the stipulated time, will be most difficult or impossible to accurately determine, it is mutually agreed that the damages to the Owner for such delay and failure on the part of the Bidder shall be liquidated in the amount of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), for each and every calendar day by which the Bidder shall fail to complete the work or any part thereof within the provisions hereof, and such liquidated damages shall not be considered as a penalty.

The Owner will deduct and retain out of any money due or to become due hereunder the amount of the liquidated damages, and in case those amounts are less than the amount of actual liquidated damages, the Bidder shall pay the difference upon demand of the Owner.

We understand that liquidated damages may be assessed should we fail to meet the stipulated completion date. Specifically, liquidated damages will be assessed daily beginning **August 2, 2024** until such a time that Substantial Completion is achieved and further if all work is not completed by the Final Completion Date.

#### **BIDS TO REMAIN FIRM**

The price stated in this Proposal shall be guaranteed for a period of not less than 60 days from the bid due date and if authorized to proceed within that period, the bidder agrees to complete the work covered by the Proposal at said price.
